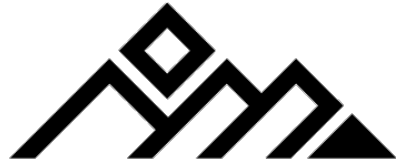

Banff Sport Medicine, in affiliation with the University of Calgary Section of Orthopaedics, is pleased to offer a fellowship in Sports Medicine and Arthroscopic Reconstruction of the Knee and Shoulder. It is based out of Banff, Alberta, Canada. Currently, this program is designed around a 1 year fellowship, and is open to all graduates of Canadian Orthopaedic programs as well as any international institutions which meet our criteria for training. Graduates of Canadian programs and self-funded applicants will be given preference.

Training will include advanced arthroscopic reconstruction of the knee and shoulder, with an emphasis on primary and revision ACL reconstructions but also treatment of recurrent patellar instability, tibial and femoral osteotomies, osteochondral allograft transplantation, shoulder stabilization surgery including Bankart repair, Laterjet, remplissage, and rotator cuff repair. As a community hospital facility, some basic trauma coverage will also be encountered.

Fellows will be expected to be intimately involved in the research program and clinical work. The latter comprises weekly intake and follow up clinics, OR days, and research participation. Opportunities for teaching of residents and medical students are intermittently available. Banff Sport Medicine is particularly fortunate to have its own Research Coordinator with a very active research program. Fellows will be expected to present and publish a research project during their fellowship. Fellows may attend pertinent conferences to present their research. Funding for conferences will depend on the quality of the research project.

Remuneration for Canadian graduates will be from surgical assisting fees. International Medical School graduates need to be self-funded. Start up expenses (College of Physicians and Surgeons of Alberta (CPSA) licensing fee, CMPA, tuition fee and PGME administration fee) are the responsibility of the Fellow. Research funding is available for appropriate and high quality proposals by application.

Interested applicants are asked to forward a letter of intent, current curriculum vitae and three supportive letters of reference.
